Why is the cross on the Hungarian coat of arms tilted (bent)? The tilted cross on the image of the crown in the coat of arms repeats a detail of the crown of St. Stephen (István), the first Hungarian Christian king. The crown of Stephen I consists of two connected crowns: the "Latin" crown (two metal bands crossed in the shape of a cross above the head, with Christ Pantocrator depicted at the intersection of the bands) and the "Byzantine" crown (a golden diadem with portraits of saints, the Byzantine emperor, and King Göza). Which country's coat of arms does not feature a crown?
