Why is Brazil called Brazil? According to one version, the name comes from Portuguese pau-brasil "brazilwood," from Portuguese brasa "embers, burning coals." According to another version, it derives from the name of the island of Brazil (O'Breasil, Hi-Brasil) from Irish mythology – a mythical land in the Atlantic Ocean. The toponym is a Greek-origin word consisting of two parts: topos "place" and onoma or onima, "name." Therefore, toponyms are proper names of rivers, lakes, swamps, settlements, streets, specific landforms, or in other words, geographical names. What are toponyms called that reflect the names of rivers?
